Chris, along with flutist Carolyn May, violinist Michèle Lekas and cellist, Mark Lekas, recorded the compositions in July at the WFMT Studio in Chicago.

These two compositions as well as Chris' song cycle *Within the Circle of the Seasons* for tenor and piano will be presented at a concert titled *Insight and Odyssey* at the Unitarian Church of Hinsdale on Saturday, October 20th at 7:00 PM. The concert is being held as a tribute to the church's retiring minister, Rev. Edward Searl. It is a free concert but, due to limited seating, reservations are necessary. DGMC Apparel

We are excited to announce that you can now purchase your own DGMC clothing with our new logo embroidered on it.



We've partnered with Lands' End to bring you a great selection of apparel and gear which you can order with the DGMC logo. You must order through the E-Store link on our website. You can find this E-Store link in the left margin of most of our web pages or under *Quick Links* in the right margin of our web pages.

There are no minimum purchase requirements, just a straight \$5.95 embroidery fee for each item which displays our logo. Simply go to our E-Store and select the clothing items in the sizes and colors you desire. After making each selection, you will be asked if you want to add a logo. You will be given only two choices from a drop down menu. Our standard logo is blue and gold, and works best for lighter fabrics. If you wish to order a dark garment, such as black or navy, select "logo for dark garment" instead; this will produce a logo which has white text but keeps the music staff gold.
